OVERVIEW

Our research question looks how online support networks have affected people who were figuring out their gender identity during the pandemic.

We hypothesize that online support and representation, coupled with the social isolation of the pandemic, played a key role in the development of an individuals' gender identity.




SURVEY AND RECRUITMENT

- We launched a recruitment survey through Qualtrics that over 1,000 LGBTQ+ people took.
- Our team advertised this survey through social media platforms and our own online communities.
- We also created a recruitment flyer and a Linktree to advertise our survey.
- · Those that fit our eligibility criteria were then invited to be interviewed.

INTERVIEWS

- We conducted qualitative video interviews with transgender and nonbinary people aged 18-40
- We started these interviews asking for a participants' pronouns and pseudonym and reading them our consent sheet before recording.
- We recorded at least 14 interviews about topics like: life before the pandemic, their process of realizing their gender identity, social media and information gathering, and changes in their lives since the pandemic.
